Save the Orphans is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the lives of orphans and displaced families in Moldova (Europe's poorest country) and neighboring areas.

We provide food, clothing, school supplies, and hygiene necessities for orphans, social orphans, and extended families, as well as support for orphanages and transitional homes.

Our support aims to keep families together and to enable orphans to complete their education (vocational and university level) while protecting them from human trafficking.

Our Chairman Sylvia Mader, along with our Director of Operations in Moldova, has been helping Moldovan orphans since 2007.

In May, Sylvia visited Moldova and was able to sponsor our programs for orphan care over a period of 10 days.







DIVITA GRATE UNIVERSITY AND ORHEI ORPHANAGE

DAY 1 & 2

I was graciously picked up at the airport and able to stay on the Campus of the Divita Gratiae University (UDG).

I enjoyed meeting with faculty and students of the Master of Social Work

(MSW) program of counseling and social work. I was also able to meet with Dr. Dumitru Sevastian, the Dean of Faculty of Theology and Serghei Namesnic, the Provost of DAMaGratiae University.

Our local Director of Moldova Operations is Diana Todica; she coordinated and oversaw all logistics of the trip. We visited the Orhei orphanage with 10 students and their guitars. At this orphanage there are about 240 severely handicapped male orphans. Half are restricted to their beds and cannot walk or talk. However, they have the most amazing smiles when you speak to them or touch them on their foreheads or cheeks. For the other orphans we were able to sing songs and visit as we gave out gifts of socks and fresh fruits.







BULBOACA AND CARPINENI ORPHANAGES

DAY 4 & 5

The students from the University along with Diana and I visited both the Bulboaca and Carpineni Orphanages. At these orphanages we are able to offer our full program of playing games, singing songs, and lectures. We spoke about the importance of selfesteem and confidence, which is always a struggle for orphans, as well as breaking the cycle of alcoholism and violence from their early childhoods.







We gave out personalized t-shirts and hats with the message "you are beautiful." We spoke about the value of education as their key for future success and how to protect themselves from the dangers of human trafficking.
